1. How does God becoming a piece of meat change the way you feel about God's love for you?
2. I am sure Zechariah and Elizabeth were frustrated when it appeared God was ignoring their prayers for a child. In reality, God's plans were to give them an amazing son, at an amazing time and an amazing story to tell. How does Zechariah and Elizabeth's story help when you pray for things that God doesn't appear to hear?
3. It was important for Zechariah to be the pastor of his home before he could be the pastor of his church. How did God use his family Bible study to change the world? If you have children, how is the Holy Spirit challenging you in this area?
4. In our culture, a good life is considered a long life. According to Matthew 11:11, John's life was not long, but it was significant. What makes life significant in God's eyes?
5. When John confronted sin in society, why were Pharisees, the religious conservatives, upset? What does this teach us about the deep-rooted nature of our pride and reliance on ourselves rather than God's grace?
6. In this Scripture, we learned how God was sovereign over John the Baptist's birth. Was God also sovereign over the manner and time of his death (Genesis 50:20; Ephesians 1:3f)? How does God's sovereignty help you face tough times in life?
7. What are ways pride subtly makes us think we are important? What are subtle ways we make too little of Jesus and too much of ourselves?
8. When we are discouraged and self-deprecating because of our sin or failures, how does knowing we are loved by Christ provide us with all the significance we need?
